Our <u>Responsible Dog Ownership - Day (RDO-Day)</u> on Sep 10th was a great success! Thanks again to all our volunteers who helped us making this a fun and smooth day, and congratulations to our CGC participants. All participating dogs showed their great potential to become very well behaved citizens, some of them just need a little more fine-tuning. We're already looking forward to next year, when we'll also celebrate 10 years of year-round professional training with The Better Companion! Mark your calendar for Saturday, Sep 8th, 2012!

<u>NEW: Introduction to Treibball - Class!</u> Starts Tuesday, Oct 11; reduced signup rate until Sep 27th. We now offer Treibball as a class, not practice. After you have taken the Intro class, you can continue with Treibball Beginner, Intermediate and Advanced levels. This will be 6-week classes, with a maximum of 6 dogs per class. The first TB-Intro class will run on Tuesdays from 5:15pm to 6:15pm. All students who had so far 4 or less practices with their dogs will need to take this class before continuing to the next level. There won't be any Treibball practice available for our already practicing students during that time, so if you'd like to continue and strengthen your basics, your best choice is to take the class!

Agility classes are <u>starting up again Saturday</u>, Oct 1st. We'll be indoors on our matted flooring. We'll need your commitment to taking a class by Sunday, 9/25, to decide the class splits. We might offer a second beginner class, if we get enough sign-ups! Participants will receive an email with the final class times and if they made it into a class on Monday or Tuesday after that.

Our <u>TTouch Workshop in November is filling up</u>! We have invited a TTouch instructor to teach us about this method to calm, increase confidence and lower stress in our dogs – at home, out and about or at the veterinary hospital. We have **auditing spots left**, all working spots are filled as of now. You could pay for an auditing spot and let us know if you'd be interested in moving up to a working spot, if enough people before you cancel. It's a long time, and we expect to have some drop-outs - where life just comes in between. Please read the specifics about the workshop below, we had a slight time change for Sunday!

November 2011: TTouch Workshop - new times for Sunday!

All working spots are full at this point, but you can sign up for an auditing spot, and if enough people drop out before then, you might still get a working spot for this wonderful workshop! **Deadline for the pre-registration fee is Sep 30, so don't delay!**

TTouch is a system of gentle touches and body work, non-habitual movement and groundwork exercises, to calm, relax and focus your dog. It enhances balance and well-being and can help your dog with:

- Nervousness, tension and stress
- Excessive barking and chewing
- Leash pulling and jumping up

- Fear and shyness, hyperactivity
- Car sickness
- Aging
- Digging and scratching

Bonus Class: DeStressing through Energy Balancing

3-5 techniques will be demonstrated and explained, for DeStressing your dog (and you), through energy balancing:

Chakra Connecting, Chakra Balancing, EFT, Acupressure, and EEM Daily Energy Routine.

This is a 1-day workshop with one bonus hour Sunday evening for all attendees.

We'll continue some of our now outdoor sports (treibball, flyball) inside during the winter, if the demand is there. Possibly on Tuesday evenings, sharing with Nose Work. We'll work on offering Mushing and Skijoring again this winter, coming up Jan/Feb 2012.

3) HOW TO SIGN UP FOR THE CLASSES:

It's easy!!! On our webpage <u>www.bettercompanion.com</u>, use the menu bar on the left. You'll find a button "Classes", with the subtitle "Registration", which brings you directly to the **one registration form for ALL classes and workshops**. After clicking "enroll" at the end, you'll get to the pricing and payment page, which explains all payment options, policies, and allows you to pay online, too. You can also check out the pricing page first, to learn about prices, payment and cancellation policies. Please note that **some workshops have their own cancellation policy**, even though they use the same registration form as the classes. Take advantage of our **pre-registration fee** by signing up a minimum of

14 days before the start of your class. Different deadlines might apply to some of the workshops and seminars.

<u>Puppy 1 Preschool clients</u>, please remember you can also purchase the **Puppy School Packet**, including P1 and P2 class. You only have to commit to the six weeks of P1 class, and will receive a voucher for P2, valid for 1 full year! For <u>P2</u> <u>voucher holders</u>, the voucher will be your payment. After you fill out the registration form for P2, you can email us the voucher number, mail the voucher to us or drop it off at the facility.

Reserve your spot! Please note **our registration policy:** <u>**Only the payment will hold your spot</u>** Spots are reserved in the order we receive payment for them. **Always sign up for the class you want to join**, even if it could be full. Only the payment will keep you on the waiting list, in case somebody else drops out before the class starts. **Your payment is never lost**, even if the class is already full. Your payment will 1) save you a spot at the class, or 2) save you a spot on the waiting list, or 3) can be carried over to a later class, or 4) can be refunded if I couldn't get you in the class you chose, or 5) can cause me to open an overflow class ©. Just as a note: I sometimes get up to three dogs per class moved in from a waiting list before the class even starts. **We can take credit card payments over the phone and at the facility**.</u>

4) DOGGY DAYCARE AND OPEN PLAY TIMES:

Doggy Daycare: Offered on Tuesdays and Thursdays 6am-7pm, with their playtime ending at 5pm, at which time they'll be kenneled if not picked up before.

Open Play Time: Canceled for Nov 25, Thanksgiving week

Come with your dog for one hour of dog play and dog owner social time. Each dog must be supervised by an adult handler, one dog per handler only. <u>Vaccinated dogs only</u> (5-way/DHPPi, dogs over 6 mo: Rabies, Bordetella). We also require having the dog dewormed or a fecal sample checked.

<u>First-timers:</u> bring your <u>vaccination papers</u>, we want to see them! Dogs over 6 months, please for the first time <u>make an appointment with us to come on a</u> <u>Friday</u>, when Claudia and Frank are managing the play times. After that, we'll discuss with you which hour will be best and if you can come Mondays as well.

Fee: \$7 at the door or punch card \$35 for 6 visits.

Our Open Play Times (indoors + outdoors) have become a safe playground for dogs of any size due to our size restrictions for each group. Only timid and absolutely non-reactive dogs can be slightly heavier than the group limit <u>The group from 7-8pm (large dogs) is limited to 8 dogs</u>, and reservations can be made in advance. Just call us and we explain the details. Every Monday AND Friday:

5-6pm: puppies, toy and small dogs up to 25#

6-7pm: puppies and medium adult dogs 30-50# (giant breed puppies can be heavier)

7-8pm: Large adult dogs over 60# (indoors: 8 dogs max; outdoors: 10 dogs max) 8-9pm: By appointment only –for evaluations. \$35

5) THE LEASH-REACTIVE DOG

You see them around, you might own one: That dog who lunges towards other dogs when being walked on leash in public. It looks like a 'killer dog', an aggressive dog, that if the leash breaks will tear the other dog in pieces. It's annoying, scary, embarrassing, and frustrating - for the by passer and the owner of such a dog.

Some of these dogs are known to be ok with other dogs off-leash, even go to daycare or dog parks. Some of them might be ready to attack if given the chance, but they all started out to attack out of self-defense at some point. Trying to get the other dog to move further away, to keep them at a comfort zone.

And often these dogs get worse, because of a wrong interpretation of their behavior. People think they have to correct them, telling them that this behavior is wrong, showing them who's boss, and that they can't do that! So the dogs get scolded, pulled back by the choke chain, jerked, tugged and what-not. No matter how the dog's behavior might have started, latest now any dog would HATE to see another dog appearing:

"Don't come closer, I'm about to get in trouble because of you!" they want to say. As the other dog approaches, they become more intense: "No stay away, I'm getting in trouble!" And sure they do. They knew it would come. Another leash jerk, another scolding, another unhappy owner.

It starts with frustration. Maybe he just wants to get to know other dogs. Imagine you live on Mars only around Martians. Finally you see another human from the distance, but 'your' Martian won't let you go and meet. Wouldn't you shout and pull towards that other human? That Martian scolds you and pulls you back, and since you don't speak his language, you can just keep shouting and pulling, to show what you want.

Your frustration will grow each time you see and can't meet another human. And if the repetitive correction of the Martian starts getting to you, you finally won't want to meet other humans anymore. They become scary. You also will have lost the practice of how to interact with other humans, and thinking they might be as unpredictable as your Martian, they become enemies you really don't want to meet anymore.

Can you imagine how those dogs feel now? Living with us humans - that unpredictable species?

That insecurity, frustration, and fear can't be treated with power, scolding and correction Such a dog needs help, to re-learn social interaction with other dogs, to learn to trust other dogs again, and to trust his owner.

Positive reinforcement training is the only correct approach for leash-aggressive dogs!
