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# PART I: News

### **Recapping our RDO-weekend**

**Our Responsible Dog Ownership weekend** was a spectacle! We had about 150 guests, a dozen vendors were set up mostly inside, we had a different dog demo about every hour and presented over 25 breeds throughout Saturday. Frank grilled almost 150

hot dogs and we served soft drinks, water and cookies with it. On Sunday, 13 dogs participated in the Canine Good Citizen ®-test and only 2 dogs need a tiny bit more practice, the other 11 dogs passed! Congratulations to all of you, you all did wonderful! In the afternoon we had a good crowd attending our annual Red Cross Dog First Aid class - you'll all get the cards from the American Red Cross mailed to you shortly! Thanks to everybody who helped make this event a success!

### Second step of our price increase: October 15th

We told you in the spring that we'll have a two-step increase of our fees, with the first step having taken place July 1<sup>st</sup> of this year. I'm delaying the second part a couple weeks until October 15<sup>th</sup>, to give everybody a chance to sign up for a class before that, especially our fun classes starting October 14 and 15. The class fee for a regular 6-week class will increase by \$10, so take advantage of the lower fee right now and sign up for the class of your choice before Oct 15<sup>th</sup>! Credits for a class in our credit list will have Dollar value, so you might have to add \$10 when you use a former full class credit after Oct 15<sup>th</sup>. You can avoid this by using your credit before Oct. 15<sup>th</sup> to sign up for a specific class. **ANY class registered and paid for before Oct.** 15<sup>th</sup> will be at the **current price.** Open Play Time punch cards will also increase, daycare fees will not increase. ## PART III: Classes + Workshops

### Section: March 14: C.L.A.S.S. course

This class is designed to practice Canine Life and Social Skills (CLASS) in form of games and real-life role play. We'll work on handler skills like fading out treats and repeat cues, changing easy exercises into nice challenges while working on the dogs' manners for our regular day-to-day lives.

### ℅ Oct 15: Treibball

We're planning on two hours of Treibball, one for new beginners and one for our intermediate and advanced students. Treibball is a great way to mix fun and control,

tricks and useful behaviors, and exercise for small or large spaces. Your dog will in a playful way learn to be sent out and to push an exercise ball - or not push it, which means self control once they know how much fun that is! For the intermediate and advanced Treibballers, we're planning on a practice for everybody who joins Nancy Tanner's online Treibball League for this winter. We'll help each other practice for Nancy's challenges and videotape each other to be able to send the results in. This is a private league and your videos never go public unless you choose that option. So you'll only have to pay the sports punch card fee, but will also have to pay for Nancy's league. Push on!

### Sect 15: Freestyle class - brand new: dog dancing class

Another way to improve your teamwork with your dog is this fun class! Heel to music, add some fun turns and easy tricks and voila - you're dancing with your dog! No dancing pre-requisites needed - most of the moves are obedience moves to music. Watch this <u>video</u> and get inspired, then come to this class taught by Ella-Kate. Only 6 dogs maximum to ensure lots of quality time with your dog! Experience for yourself how this activity improves your dog's focus on you in just 6 weeks!

### m Nov 3: Weight Pulling class! Once a year only!

Teach your dog to pull the kid's sled, firewood, or just a tire for more exercise in the winter (and summer). Any dog over one year with a pulling attitude is welcome! No size restrictions! You'll learn about the equipment, how to encourage the dog to pull and how to increase the weight without losing the dog's interest. Equipment and harnesses will be provided for this class. If you have your own harness or equipment, bring it! Because of the specific harness the dogs will wear for this activity, this does NOT ruin your efforts to teach your dog NOT to pull when you walk them on a regular leash and collar or head halter. This class will consist of two sessions held on **two Sundays, Nov 3 and 10 from 1-2:30pm. Sign up before Oct 15 and save double!** Get the lower fee before the price increase AND the pre-registration discount.

### **My Dog Got Kicked Out of Daycare**

### My Dog Got Kicked Out of Daycare Today

I received an email the other day that started with, "My dog got kicked out of daycare today." It was from a dog owner I knew. She loves her dog and was looking for outlets for his energy. She is a fantastic owner — the kind every dog trainer wants to meet. She was bonded to her dog, committed to his well-being, and loved to hear advice from pet professionals on how to improve her dog's life. So she emailed me to find out what she had done wrong. She needed to express her embarrassment with her dog, and wanted to cry on my shoulder (virtually) and find out what she should be doing to fix what she viewed as her dog's problems.

She had a lovely dog, with no behavioral problems. The dog was friendly with people, well mannered in the house, walked nicely on leash and was absolutely adored by everyone in the family. But there was this one problem....her dog got kicked out of daycare today.

My advice to her? "Just don't go to the daycare and don't go to dog parks." That's it. No magic wand to fix a problem. No behavioral modification program to force her dog to tolerate the presence of large numbers of other dogs. No litany of tools and tricks she should use to get her dog to accept the environment of off-leash play. Just don't go to the daycare or dog park. That's it.

Far too often we try to force our pets into environments they may not like. And when we do, the dog suffers. I've seen shy dogs taken to crowded parades. The dog is not happy. I've seen sound sensitive dogs taken to fireworks displays. The dog is not happy. And I've seen dogs who don't particularly enjoy the company of other dogs taken to dog parks and daycares. The dog is not happy.

Most of the times these situations occur because well-meaning dog owners are trying to do things they think would be fun for their dog. In the excitement of taking the dog someplace new, many owners fail to notice how their dog is responding to the new environment. I recommend looking to the dog for clues as to what makes them happy. Watch for loose, wiggly body language in your dog. If your dog is hiding, shaking, jumping up on you, or appears more nervous than when you are hanging out at home, he's probably not happy.

Not every dog likes off-leash play and that's ok. It's not a statement about the dog or a fault in training. It's about an environment that just isn't a good fit for a particular dog. Just like an evening at the fireworks isn't the best environment for a dog who is sound sensitive and a crowded parade isn't the best environment for a dog who doesn't enjoy crowds, an off-leash play environment isn't the best place for a dog that doesn't enjoy playing with other dogs.

When a dog doesn't do well in off-leash play it is not necessarily a symptom of a problem, or a bad dog or a dog in need of behavioral modification. This might be the case, but more often than not, it's just a dog who prefers people. It's a dog who would rather hang out with the people he loves than dogs he doesn't know. It's a dog who would love a hike in the woods but doesn't enjoy off-leash play with a group of other dogs. This doesn't make the dog bad.

But is this normal? Don't all dogs want to play with other dogs? Shouldn't I socialize him so he gets used to it? I get asked these questions all the time. The truth is, there are far more dogs who do not enjoy off-leash play, than there are dogs who love it.

When a pet care professional dismisses your dog from daycare or recommends you don't go to the dog park, you should thank them. Thank them for caring more about your pet, than about making a buck by bringing your dog into their facility if the dog isn't

going to enjoy the off-leash environment. Thank them for seeing your dog as a unique animal with individual temperament traits. Thank them for trying to look out for the wellbeing of your pet and putting your dog's safety and comfort first.

What if your dog doesn't like the off-leash play? It's ok. You are not a bad owner and your dog is not a bad dog. Just find other ways to exercise your dog that don't involve interacting with other dogs. Go for a walk, take a hike, give your dog a massage, or try some activity such as agility, Rally, or nose work. You'll both have a great time bonding, and your dog will be happy.
