# **MONTHLY STORY: CLAUDIA & SALLY'S TRIP TO GERMANY!**

This was a dream of mine: going **back to the roots of my love for dogs** with my beloved dog Sally! Germany was where it all started - my love for dogs, walking dogs, taking daytrips with them, bicycling, riding the metro, dog parks, the forests, fields, and most of it off leash.

It would be a test for me and Sally if I trained her well enough for **the city life of Munich**, including the many visits with friends and family. And last October I finally was able to take time off and book the best flight connection for Sally: Anchorage, AK to Frankfurt, Germany direct. If you don't know my Sally, she's an Aussie/Husky mix and now 11 years young. She's in very good shape and still pretty active.

Sally did wonderful! We started right away from the airport walking over one hour with my brother and his dog along the road side, and found a couple areas where Sally could be off-leash already. My brother told me later that he was very surprised about his dog never growling at my Sally. She usually is rather insecure with new dogs and they often come at her too quickly, but my Sally was just happy that his dog didn't jump at her, and so they were good friends from the beginning, rather ignoring each other.

We came across several friends or relatives who didn't own a dog and weren't sure about a dog in their home, but Sally with her charm, tricks and calm behavior won them all! She ended up being allowed on more couches than I expected, and **my mom's bed** became her favorite resting spot in her apartment while we sat together in the living room.

One highlight of the trip was the participation at a **Treibball workshop** with Sally. I learned a ton about the roots of Treibball, and how in Germany the herding community revolted against the comparison of Treibball with their activity. In their opinion herding has a lot to do with the behavior of the sheep (or other herded animals), and how the herding dog reacts to that. The herding instincts are often triggered by the specific movement of the herded animal, which can't be done with a gymnastic ball.

This statement actually opened up the sport of **Treibball to all dogs**, not only herding dogs, and helped the sport grow even more. Now it was clear that this is just another new distance handling activity for any dog, no herding instinct needed, even better! I learned about different approaches to sending the dog away behind the ball, and saw some amazing dogs. I found a new friend in the workshop instructor, who also teaches clicker training, freestyle and other fun games and activities in weekend workshops at different dog-friendly hotels.

And then we met Sally! I mean **the human counterpart!** My Sally is actually named after a human friend of ours, who encouraged Frank to call me up after 5 years of separation. If she wouldn't have been as persistent as she was, Frank wouldn't have had the guts to call me. He thought I'm probably happily married with kids already  $\odot$ . Because of Sally, he did call me and we connected again, and we were married within a year after that. For eleven years I was hoping Sally would someday meet Sally! And since human Sally never got around to visiting us here, I had to bring my four legged Sally to her!
